The **Christingle Service** is an Advent tradition in Saint Columba's Church! It's a family-friendly service (approx. 45 minutes) where a candle in an orange is used as a fun and interactive symbol of Jesus Christ and the positive effect he has had on the world. The word 'Christingle' comes from the German word 'Christkindl' which means 'Little Christ Child'. The Christingle is used to celebrate and symbolise Jesus Christ as the Light of the World. The candles in the Christingles are lit to spread light. This reflects the light that Jesus Christ brings to the world, and gives hope to people living in dark times.

The Christingles are made by the children (with parental supervision & help!) during the service to help teach them about Jesus. Towards the end of the service, the lights are dimmed and the children's Christingles are lit up. It's a magical and reverential moment when the entire church is lit with the glow of the Christingles!


This is a free event and you don't need to bring anything. To ensure the organisers have enough Christingle materials for all the children, it would be great if you would please RSVP by clicking the link below.

Remembrance Sunday and remembrance services, be they civil or religious or a combination of both, have a poignant moment when it strikes you, that brave men and women fought and died in the two world wars so that we may live in freedom today.



A combined civil and religious service was held in Clonmethan graveyard to remember those in the Fingal region that gave up their lives.

That poignant moment came as The Last Post was played on the bugle, and silence fell.

At that point, we remembered what it was like for these brave souls as they stood on the front line.

As each name was read out by Peter Rooney, you could almost imagine them.

Several of them were only eighteen years old when they were killed in action.

As Peter said, they are not forgotten while we still call out their names.

The following prayer was read for them and their families.

Almighty and eternal God,

We pray for the brave women and men, who gave up their lives for our freedom. We pray for their families whose sacrifice was often unseen.

Hear our prayers and thanksgivings for all who we remember this day;

fulfil in them the purpose of your love;


and bring us all, with them, to your eternal joy;
